
#### **Foundations Teaching Instructions**

#### What is Foundations?

Foundations<sup>1</sup> is a basic overview of the Bible and hermeneutical tool to equip followers of Jesus to understand, apply, and teach others God's Word. In Bible school terms, Foundations teaches Old Testament and New Testament Survey, Beginning Hermeneutics, and a Preaching Practicum. Foundations is more than a set of training materials, but rather it seeks to integrate what Christ followers may already know with what they still need to learn. In this way, Foundations is a process for providing tools for followers of Jesus and churches to abide in Christ daily, and to teach others His Word.

#### How is Foundations taught?

Foundations is divided into 5 sections. Each section includes 1 summarizing overview story, 1 timeline that gives a visual understanding of the section, and 5 individual Bible stories that give an in depth understanding of that section of the Bible. With each overview story and individual story there are drawings to give visual aid to what is occurring in the story, and this is very helpful to those in the training who are not able to read and/or write.




#### How to use the Foundations workbook?

There is a workbook component to each of the 25 individual Bible stories. With each story there are corresponding drawings, as well as a main point sentence that gives a summary of that story. The page after the story is designed to encourage the trainee to read 2 specific chapters from the Bible that are connected to the Bible story. For each of the 2 chapters there are four questions that are to be asked to give a better understanding of the Bible story. The following 4 questions should be asked and answered from each chapter: 1) What do I learn about God? 2) What do I learn about man? 3) Is there a sin in this story that I should avoid doing? 4) Is there an example or command in this story to follow? To conclude each story there will be 2 additional questions asked: 1) What should I obey from this story? 2) What should I teach others from this story?

This Foundations training can be given over the course of 2-3 full days once a month for 5 months, or weekly for 26 weeks. Timing of when and how often to give the training can be determined based off of the availability of the pastors and/or their church members.



The Story of the Beginning of the World

**The Bible teaches that** in the beginning, there was nothing but God. God created everything in the world. God created the sun, moon, and stars. He created the plants and animals. Last, He created man. God made man different from all other things. God made man to have relationship with Him.


The first man was named Adam. His wife was named Eve. God placed Adam and Eve in a special garden. God had them manage everything that happened in it. He gave Adam and Eve freedom in the garden. God spent time with them there.

One of God's angels in heaven rebelled against God. That angel tempted Adam and Eve to disobey. Adam and Eve disobeyed a command God gave them. They sinned for the first time. This sin had to be punished. God had to send them away from His presence. He put them outside of the garden. Adam and Eve had children and their children had children and their children had children until the whole world was filled with people.

Years later, God spoke to a man named Abraham. God said, "Leave your country and your people...and go to the land that I will show you. I will make a huge nation of people from your descendants. I will bless you and make you famous, and you will be a blessing to others. All the families on earth will be blessed through you." Abraham left as God had told him. And Abraham worshipped God.

When Abraham was old, God promised to give him a son. God said to him, "Look up...and count the stars -- if you can...so many shall your offspring be." Abraham believed God. Because he believed, God considered him to be in a right relationship with Him.

God kept His promise to Abraham and gave him a son. And his son had children and their children had children until Abraham's descendants were very numerous. 

The Bible teaches that in the beginning, there was nothing but God. God created the Heavens and the Earth in seven days. Creation happened in this way. On the first day, God created day and night. On the second day, God created the water and the sky. On the third day, God created the land and the seas. Then, He produced vegetation on the land. He created plants and trees that had seeds and fruits. And each day God saw that it was good. On the fourth day, God created the sun and moon to light the day and night that He created on the first day. The sun and moon are to set the days, months, and years. And God saw that it was good. On the fifth day, God filled the water and sky that He created on day two. He created ocean creatures and birds, all according to their own kind. God told them to be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth. And God saw that it was good. On the sixth day, God filled the earth by creating all the land creatures, livestock, and wild animals according to their own kind. And God saw that it was good. Then, God said, "Let us make man in our own image." And He did and said it was very good. On the seventh day, God rested from His work. God blessed the seventh day and made it holy. God created a garden in the east, in Eden. He put the man, called Adam, in this garden to take care of it. God saw that man needed a helpmate, but none could be found. So God put Adam in a deep sleep and created woman from man's own body to be a companion for him. She was called Eve. Since woman is the same flesh as man, they are to join together and marry. The Story of God's Judgment for the First Sin (Genesis 2 & 3)




The Bible teaches that God put Adam in the Garden of Eden to take care of it. God told him he could eat from any tree in the garden except from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil. If he ate from that tree, he would die. Satan, God's enemy, was disguised as a serpent. He tempted Eve by questioning what God told her. He told Eve that if she ate from that tree, she would not die; her eyes would be opened and she would be like God, knowing good and evil. Eve saw that the fruit of the tree was lovely and would give her knowledge. So she took some and ate it. She also gave some to Adam, and he ate it. Their eyes were opened, and they realized they were naked. So they covered themselves with fig leaves. Later, when God was walking in the garden and wanted to have fellowship with them, they hid. God called out to them. They told God that they were hiding because they were naked. God asked how they knew they were naked. God also asked if they had eaten from the forbidden tree. The man immediately blamed the woman. The woman blamed the snake that tempted her. Although both man and woman blamed another, God had to punish them for their disobedience. God condemned the serpent to crawl on the ground and be in opposition to woman for all time. God increased the woman's childbearing pain. God cursed the ground because of man's sin. 

Later, God spoke to Abraham again. God told him to make a burnt offering. God said to take his only son, Isaac, whom he loved and present him as a sacrifice to God. Abraham had faith and did as God instructed. He took Isaac, two servants, a donkey, and wood for a burnt offering and departed. After three days, they reached the place God had instructed, This is the location where Jerusalem would later be built. Abraham left the servants and the donkey. He and Isaac went on toward the place Isaac asked his father why there was nothing to offer as a of the offering. sacrifice. Abraham replied that the Lord would provide the offering. When they reached Moriah, Abraham built an altar and arranged the wood for a burnt offering. In faith, Abraham bound his son and put him on the altar, on top of the wood. (Genesis 37-47)



**Teach:** Joseph in Egypt (Genesis 37-47)

The Bible teaches that one of Isaac's sons was Jacob. Jacob had twelve sons. Most of Joseph's brothers did not like him Jacob's favorite son was Joseph. because their father treated him best. One day, they were far from their father. The brothers sold Joseph to travelers who were going to Egypt. Then, they told Jacob that he was killed. In Egypt, Joseph was sold as a slave to a leader in the The Lord blessed Joseph and made him very successful. Joseph maintained his integrity and avoided sin in all that he did. Eventually, he interpreted a dream for the king. The dream showed that there would be seven years of plentiful crops followed by seven years of famine. Because of Joseph's wisdom, the king made him the most powerful person in Egypt except for the king. The king put Joseph in charge of collecting grain during the years of plenty and distributing food during the years of famine. Jacob and Joseph's brothers still lived in Canaan where there was also famine. Jacob sent all the brothers except the youngest, Benjamin, to Egypt to buy grain. They came to Joseph and asked for help. Joseph recognized them, but they did not know him. Joseph gave them food and sent them away. He said if they wanted more food, they would need to bring their brother, Benjamin. When his family again ran out of food, they returned and brought Benjamin with them. After Benjamin was accused of stealing, all the brothers offered to pay Benjamin's debt. This showed that Joseph's brothers had changed. Joseph revealed his identity to them and instructed them to bring their father to see him. Jacob came to Egypt with his family. Jacob was very happy to see Joseph, the son he thought was dead. The king gave them some of the best land in Egypt. The family grew and was very successful. And this is a story from God's Word.



#### Deliverance

The Story of God Fulfilling His Promise

The Bible teaches that many generations after Abraham, the Israelites became slaves in Egypt. In slavery, the people cried out to God for deliverance. God heard their cry. God sent a man named Moses to deliver them. God told Moses to lead His people to the Promised Land. Moses performed miraculous signs. These proved that God had spoken to him. Finally, after many signs, the Egyptians let the Israelites go.

God led His people out of Egypt, and He gave His law to the people. The law included the Ten Commandments. God wanted His people to be holy and fellowship with Him. God did not want them to be like other nations.


After the people received God's law, they continued on their journey to the land that God promised to Abraham. God told them to enter the Promised Land. But, they disobeyed God and did not enter the Promised Land. Because they disobeyed, God caused the Israelites to wander in the desert until the people who disobeyed died. Even Moses died, so Joshua became the leader of the Israelites.

Joshua led the people across the Jordan River and into the Promised Land. Then, Joshua and the people drove the inhabitants from the land. The Israelites settled it for themselves. Each family was given land. This was their inheritance of God's promise to Abraham.

After a long time, Joshua became old. He called the leaders of the Israelites together. Joshua said, "Worship the Lord your God only. Throw away any other gods that you have. Choose today who you will serve, but as for me and my house we will serve the Lord." The leaders agreed with Joshua. They said they would follow only God the Creator.

For two generations, the Israelites kept their word and followed God alone. After that, the Israelites turned from the one true God and followed false gods. God was angry with His people. He allowed them to become slaves to other nations.

Time and again a good ruler would lead the people to follow the true God. After the good ruler died, the people would again turn to other gods. This was repeated over and over. **And this is a story from God's Word.**

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

**Teach:** Exodus (Exodus 2-14)

1. Share the story twice by reading or memory:



God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and I will take you to the land that I promised." Moses had faith. He went back to Pharaoh. He asked him again to let the Hebrews go. This time, he gave signs from God. Pharaoh still would not let the people go. The Lord brought 10 terrible plagues on the Egyptians. The final plague was to kill all the firstborn sons in Egypt. But, before the final plague, God told Moses that each Hebrew family was to sacrifice a lamb. They were to take the lamb's blood and put it around the door frames where they would eat the lamb. They were to eat quickly and be ready to move. God sent an angel to kill the firstborn sons. When the angel saw blood on a doorframe, he passed over and did not kill anyone. This is The Lord's Passover. The angel killed the firstborn sons in every house without the blood. Then, Pharaoh told Moses to have the Hebrews leave. 



Moses went down the mountain and told the people what God said. They all said they would obey God's commands. Moses took their answer back to the Lord. The Lord told Moses that when He speaks to him, He will come in a cloud. "The people will hear Me speaking to you and will always put their trust in you." 





The Story of God's Chosen Leaders Ruling

The Bible teaches that after some time, the Israelite people cried out to God's spokesman, Samuel. They said, "Every other nation around has a king. Appoint a king over us so we will be like other nations." God heard what His people asked. God said to Samuel, "The people have again rejected me as their king. Give the people what they want, but warn them: The king will take your sons and daughters and make them work for him. He will take the best from the land. When that happens, you will cry out for relief from your king; but, I will not answer you." The people still demanded a king.

God told Samuel to anoint Israel's first king, King Saul. Initially, Saul was a good king. He led the people to many great victories. But, one day Saul became impatient with God. Samuel told Saul to wait for him to give the sacrifice to the Lord, but Saul gave the sacrifice himself. When Samuel arrived, he told Saul, "To obey is better than sacrifice. Because you have rejected the word of the Lord, He has rejected you as king."

God sent Samuel to anoint another man, David, as king. David was called a man after God's own heart. David was not perfect, but he did try to lead God's people in the right way. After David, others became king. These others split the nation into two parts, Israel and Judah

Some of the kings in Israel and Judah were good kings. They led God's people to a closer relationship with Him. Some of the kings were bad kings. They led the people away from God. The Bible teaches that Solomon lived about 900 years before Christ. Solomon was the son of David, the King that God loved. God promised Solomon that if he followed God, then God would bless him. But if he did not follow God and decided to worship other gods, then God would cut Israel off from the land He had promised them. Solomon was a good king. However, he had many wives. Most of these wives were from other tribes or countries. They brought their gods with them. Solomon and the Hebrews became corrupted because they began to worship these other gods. Because Solomon turned away from God, God told him that He would tear the kingdom away from him and This did not completely occur until after Solomon's death. give it to his servant. Rehoboam was one of Solomon's sons. Rehoboam was named king after his father's death. Immediately there were problems. As he was being crowned king, the people came to him and asked him to reduce the requirements Solomon had put on them. Rehoboam sought advice from both Solomon's wise older advisors and his younger friends. He listened to his younger friends and told the people that he would place more demands on them than Solomon had. Because Rehoboam did not follow the Lord, God allowed 10 of the Hebrew tribes to rebel and form the northern kingdom called Israel. They were allowed to seek their own king. They selected Jeroboam as their king. He had been a servant to Solomon and the supervisor of his building projects. Jeroboam was not considered to be a good king because he built temples at other locations and changed the ways the people worshiped God. At first, Rehoboam was king over all of Israel since he was the son of Solomon. Because of the rebellion, His kingdom became only those tribes that remained - the tribe of Judah and most of the tribe of Benjamin. Kingdom was divided and would never again be one nation with all the tribes together. There was war between the two kingdoms for all of Rehoboam's life. And this is a story from God's Word.





The Bible teaches that Daniel was a prophet for the One True God. Daniel was born into the household of the Judean nobility about 600 years before Christ. When he was young, Babylon captured Jerusalem and carried away many of the Temple treasures along with many people. The officials of Babylon chose Daniel, three of his friends, and other the young men of the nobility to go to Babylon. They were to learn the language and culture of Babylon. As part of their training, the young men were to eat special food and drink. But, Daniel asked if he and his friends could eat their traditional food and drink, vegetables and water. After a period of testing, Daniel and his friends were healthier than the other young men. God gave these four young men great wisdom, and He gave Daniel the understanding of visions and dreams. The young men went into the service of the king of Babylon. The king had troublesome dreams and asked all his advisors the meaning of the dreams. No one could tell him except Daniel. The dream was about the remainder of the king's rule and the world after the king died. Later, the king built a statue of a god that everyone had to worship. Daniel's three friends said they would not worship any god other than the One True God. The king had them thrown into a hot furnace to die. The friends did not die and came out of the furnace without any harm to them or their clothing because God was with them. One time the king said that no one could worship anything or anyone except him. If they did, they would be killed. Daniel continued to worship the One True God and not the king. Although Daniel was the king's friend, the king could not change the law. Daniel was thrown into a lions' den in the evening. The next morning, the king ran to check on his friend. 



Near the end of the week, there was a Jewish holiday called Passover. Jesus asked His disciples to prepare a place to celebrate Passover. They ate bread and wine. 





The Story of Jesus' Followers as the Church Grows and He Returns



The Bible teaches that one of the churches that Paul started was in the city of Corinth. During that time, many idol worshippers and others turned away from their sin and believed. They were baptized and began meeting together as a church. After Paul left Corinth, the church had many problems. Because of these problems, Paul wrote letters to the church encouraging them to do better in four areas. First, Paul said that there must be no fighting in the church. People in the church were divided based on who told them the Good News or who baptized them. Paul said that these things did not matter. It only matters that you know God and that He loves you. Second, Paul said they were not behaving like mature believers. Some were getting drunk and eating too much during the Lord's Supper. Paul said when they came together to eat the Lord's Supper, they were to wait for one another. Other believers thought they were more important in the church because of their abilities or positions. Paul said that all who work for the Lord are important. All are part of the body of Christ. Everyone should be a mature believer. Third, Paul told the believers that they were living sinful lives. He reminded them that their bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. Therefore, their lives must be examples to glorify God. Paul warned them not to give in to sinful desires. He told them to do what was right. Fourth, some were saying that there was no resurrection from the dead. Paul wrote that if Christ was not raised from the dead, then believers were without hope. He said that Christ was certainly raised from the dead because of the Scripture promises and because of the many witnesses to His resurrection. Believers can look forward to spending eternity with God in Heaven. And this is a story from God's Word.


## The Thessalonian Church

The Bible teaches that Paul stayed in Thessalonica for only three weeks. Paul shared the Good News and many people, both Jews and others, placed their faith in Jesus. Some men who were not believers told everyone that Paul had caused trouble all over the world and now he was in their city. The believers sent Paul and his friends away in the middle of the night to protect them from persecution. Sometime later. Paul wrote a letter back to the church in Thessalonica. He praised them for their faith, hope, and love. They welcomed the Good News and in spite of was severe suffering, they became an example of what a church should be. Paul reminded them that even though there were threats against his life, he still preached the Good News. Paul didn't trick them into believing in Jesus but simply lived a pure and holy life. Paul thanked God because the believers eagerly accepted his message, not as a message from men, but as from God. Paul wanted to see them again, and had planned to visit. Instead he sent Timothy to see how they were doing. When Timothy returned, he told Paul the good news of their faith, hope and love! He reported that they were standing firm in the Lord! Paul told them to keep up the good work; avoid sin; and live a holy life pleasing to God. They should work for the Lord during their whole life, because Jesus will come again and give each person what he deserves. Paul encouraged them to be joyful always and pray continually. And this is a story from God's Word.




